Presentations:

Journey to a Book: Diane takes students through her writing process, from the first *AHA*! moment through drafting, revising, copyediting, proofreading, and choosing cover art to the finished product — a bound book!

Villains and Monsters: Diane talks about the "bad guys" of classic fairy tales, describes her own evil witches, bad fairies, and nasty monsters, and has students create either illustrations or descriptions of their own villains.

Baking a Book: Diane describes the process of publishing *Baker's Magic*, with a focus on research (even in a novel!) and revising.




